Leaving a Legacy: A Tribute to Arthur Blount

November 8th marks the one-year anniversary of the death of one of the most, If not the most, influential people in my life. A year ago, my dad, Arthur Blount went home to be with the Lord. He was many things. He was a husband, a father, a pastor, a community leader, a friend. Most of all I think we could qualify his life as a follower of Christ, who was intent on living with an eternal perspective. He was a disciple-maker. His discipleship started in his home where he taught his family the importance of living under the Lordship of Jesus Christ. The Word was read, taught, and lived out. It was the authority by which our home would operate. His discipleship extended to the church he was entrusted to lead. For over forty years he served the same congregation, imparting the truth of Scripture, loving the people of God unequivocally, and giving them an example of what it means to follow Christ. His discipleship extended beyond the walls of the church where he invested in individuals. It was not uncommon for him to regularly have others in his home where he and his wife hospitably invested in them. He always had a man or men that he was befriending, leading, and showing what it meant to follow our Lord. This is discipleship. Leaving a legacy is more than people remembering your name. It is building the kingdom as Jesus commanded us to do. It is living for the Lord in such a way that it is noticed when you are gone, not because you lived to make your name great, but because you lived to make His name great in such a way that others realize an example of faithfulness is no longer there.
